

APPENDIX II

**OUTCOMES OF TE ARAWA MANDATING HUI**

A table summarising the outcomes of various Te Arawa mandating hui held during the period July to September 2003 follows. The information in this table was drawn from document A2; document A114(a), pages 104 to 114; document A130, schedule 8; and document A143. It is not a complete list of all hui held – only those for which minutes have been filed in evidence are shown.

\* Resolution 2 was at first passed (27 for, 0 against) with only Eru George's name inserted. Four more nominations were subsequently made and there was then a motion that all five representatives be elected. The minutes record that this motion was carried, but the number of votes is not shown.

† The wording in the minutes simply states 'That Tuhourangi Ngati Wahiao elects', followed by the list of nominations. It was then recorded that the nominations were closed and the motion was carried. No numbers are given.

‡ The minutes state 'Motion Carried', but document A143, recording voting on the individual resolutions, shows no outcome for that particular motion.

§ As recorded in the minutes, this resolution states 'That Tuhourangi Ngati Wahiao agrees' (not Ngati Te Roro o Te Rangi).

¶ The minutes follow the same pattern as those for the Tuhourangi and Ngati Wahiao hui.

|| From the minutes, a large number of Ngati Whaoa attendees appear to have withdrawn part-way through the meeting.

\*\* In this case, the resolution passed was: 'That all nominees be accepted as the elected representatives for Ngati Tahu/Ngati Whaoa on "Nga Kaihautu O Te Arawa" in the negotiation process'. The minutes do not state which of the other resolutions were put, merely stating that they were 'Presented by Rawiri Te Whare'. However, there is reference to an 'Appendix 2 Ngati Tahu/Ngati Whaoa Resolutions'. We take this to be 'Resolutions: Ngati Tahu–Ngati Whaoa' at document A114(a), exhibit DD, pages 101 to 103, which lists all five resolutions and gives the outcome for each motion, as entered in the table above.

\* The attendees at first voted that five representatives be elected (the motion failed), and then they increased the number to eight. A motion to accept the eight nominations was carried.

† The minutes of the 're-run' are the only ones that have been presented to the Tribunal in evidence. We have seen no minutes of any earlier hui for Tapuika.

‡ This resolution is not recorded in the set of minutes attached to the deed of mandate. It comes from the alternative set of minutes at document A114(a), page 104.

§ It would appear that 11 nominations were put forward and that they were all accepted. However, there are two slightly different versions of the minutes: document A2, mandating hui 14, page 2; comp A114(a), page 105.

¶ The resolution in this case read: 'That Te Arawa ki Kirikiriroa endorse and support the decision of Te Arawa ki te Haukainga to enter into direct negotiations with the Crown to seek a comprehensive settlement of their historical claims'.

|| A resolution broadly covering the content of resolutions 3, 4, and 5 was put to the meeting. It stated: 'That Te Arawa ki Kirikiriroa endorse and supports [sic] the negotiations structure and process as presented'.

\*\* The resolution followed the same pattern as that at the Te Arawa ki Kirikiriroa hui.

†† The minutes from this hui do not appear to have been appended to the deed of mandate. The information here is as recorded in the minutes at document A114(a), pages 113 and 114.

‡‡ In the set of minutes attached to the deed of mandate, this resolution states: 'That Ngati Tuteniu agrees', not Ngati Rangiwewehi. (A corrected set of minutes is to be found at document A114(a), page 104. And the figures given are identical to those for Ngati Tuteniu.

§§ In the set of minutes attached to the deed of mandate, the names recorded are exactly the same as those for Ngati Tuteniu.
